


# “Chinese American Scientists: A Study in Transnational History of Science and Technology.”

**Abstract:** The Chinese Communist revolution in 1949 led 5000 Chinese students/scientists to become “stranded” in the US. In the next decade about 1000 of them returned to China while the rest stayed in the US, with profound impact on science and technology in both countries. This talk examines the history of these “Chinese/American scientists” as agents in the making of transnational science, focusing on their role in both the Americanization of international science and the internationalization of American science.
